The research project is entitled "La percezione dell'alterità tra (ri)narrazione e traduzione nel periodo postpandemico" (The perception of otherness between (re)narration and translation in the post-pandemic period), PI: Prof. Stefania Maci. In the first stage of the project, corpus linguistics methods are used to carry out a cross-linguistic English-Italian terminological analysis on institutional texts concerning migration. In the second stage, a corpus of narratives by and on migrants is collected, including various genres (e.g. digital narrations, documentaries, blogs) and analysed with a special focus on translations of these narratives (between English and Italian) which can be found in European digital museums. This analysis will thus also involve mapping these digital museums to study how translation practices are employed there to represent migrants' identities.

The last stage of the project consists in collecting migrants' narratives produced in the post-pandemic period, in order to analyse how otherness is perceived in this period.
